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One of my favorite ways to interact with students is through social media. After usage guidelines and norms are established, social media can be used as a powerful tool to connect with and inspire our students. Social media can also be used to engage students in meaningful conversations and promote SEL in our classrooms. Voxer is a walkie-talkie app that is designed for groups to communicate. Coupled with a social media content calendar, it is a perfect way to show your students (and their families) some LOVE inside and outside of the classroom. This calendar can also be used with Google Classroom, Remind101, Seesaw, Twitter, TikTok, or other communication tools.
